Mendoza, Argentina - Certified Organic Viticulture

Since arriving in Mendoza from Italy in 1901, the Pulenta family have devoted their lives to winemaking. Today they honour tradition with innovation through Bodega Vistalba, founded by third generation Carlos Pulenta, a man widely respected in the Argentinian community.

His daughter Paula now manages the family estate, with vineyards in Valle de Uco and one of Mendoza's oldest in Luján de Cuyo. Those Certified Organic vineyards, plus a Certified Sustainability credential issued by Bodegas de Argentina display the Bodega's environmental commitment, regard for future as well as past cultures.

Gravity flow winemaking techniques guide the fruit through concrete ferment tanks to ranging maturation vessels, negating need for pumps in the winery. The Bordeaux blend styles express a balance of concentration and vibrancy with effortless length, while Un Mundo Chiquito represents pure, unadultered Malbec.





Progenie & Tomero By Bodega Vistalba



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A tribute to the 'ditch riders' or 'Tomero', the men who employ the traditional furrow irrigation methods, where snowmelt from the Andes ranges is guided into the farmlands. Crucial for farming in the high altitude desert that is Mendoza.

From the Pulenta family's estate in Los Árboles in the Valle de Uco, Malbec is of course the star of the show, with a string of varieties in tow producing exceptional single varietal wines under the Tomero label.

The traditional method Progenie sparkling wines from Chardonnay and Pinot Noir showcase the finese capable of these elegant grapes in Mendoza.
