From the Limestone Coast, the 'Land of Tomorrow' wines take their name from the Buandik people's name for the area and of the fault line that runs through Wrattobulley, 'Kanawinka'. The Kanawinka Fault was responsible for the uplifting of the Naracoorte ranges several million years ago, contributing to the formation of the landscape of limestone and complementary soils that are ideal for winegrowing.

The property itself is stunning, one of the coolest sites in Wrattobulley with the majority being restored to woodlands and wetlands which host a range of wildlife. Native shrubs and grasses continue into the vines, further enhancing biodiversity and benefitting soil health, water retention and maintain healthy insect populations.

Whether it's the cautious innovation in the vineyard or the gentle handling through the winery by friend and famed winemaker Sue Bell, great care is taken to produce wines ever-reflective of this place.
